Eric Krait is one of our best writers, the author of two extraordinary boxes—"Herb'n'Lorna," a criticial lavorite, and the even more admirable "Reservations Recommended," as orient table had in the game of restaurant reviews that there are a manner of surfaces who longed for one more book by Krait, until now mayanable, the adventures of an unlikely best mandel Peter Leroy.

These stories, some of them a decade old were originally radio scripis. They were supposed to have been published in book form at the time they were sired, but the deal fell through. Now, Kraft has given us all of the Lercy stories, plus a new pinth one that was written for this book. They are quite as delightful

as unything he has written

The highly imaginative writing contains passages such as this one in praise of claim shells as the answer to family boredom, all in the guise of an admonification something called the Rebhington Claim Council, which urges making knicknacks from claim shells in these words: "Say, Mom. your family's counting on you They're counting on you to come up with something claver to do in the evening, manathing that will make them forget, for a lew happy hours the monetary of work and the tedium of school."

There's no monotony or tedium in these delight ful pages.
